Jonathan Green New Frontier grasses are the result of the great advances that we have made in the turf quality of perennial ryegrasses. The Jonathan Green Research Program has worked diligently for over twenty-five years to screen potential perennial ryegrass breeding candidates for their ability to survive and thrive in extreme growing conditions. The results are perennial ryegrasses that have a wide range of adaptability, superior disease resistance, drought, and wear tolerance and are naturally insect resistant. The New Frontier Perennial Ryegrasses possess a rich dark-green color that blends well with our Black Beauty Tall Fescues and Blue Panther Kentucky bluegrasses.

In unirrigated test plots on a sod farm in northern VA, New Frontier survives an extended drought which occurred from the date that the plots were planted on September 6 until mid November. This photo taken on June 3, 2008, shows that most of the other perennial ryegrasses being tested succumbed to this stress but not New Frontier, which still looked great.
